GRANTS:

Point Loma Assembly has provided financial support to other area non-profit organizations by making small Grants to them to benefit our local community. The Point Loma Assembly has been able to raise funds for small Grants with rental income from renting its historic building. Grant funds are generated and budgeted from operations and from members making individual donations. Point Loma Assembly has begun partnering with other area funders to increase support and impact. Small Grants range from \$100- \$3,000, with the average grant at \$500. Grant applications may be submitted to our Philanthropy Chair between September and March each year. Reviews are done in April with award letters sent in May followed by grants issued in June.
