Luxury movie theater THE LOT opened in Liberty Station on May 5th. The 26,000 square foot area on Truxton Road was formerly known as Luce Auditorium - a 2,200-seat theater for Navy recruits.

THE LOT's design preserves much of the original building and features a new glass-enclosed café, bar and restaurant space offering breakfast, lunch, dinner and weekend brunch.

It has six screening rooms and a concession area and will show both current films and art films.

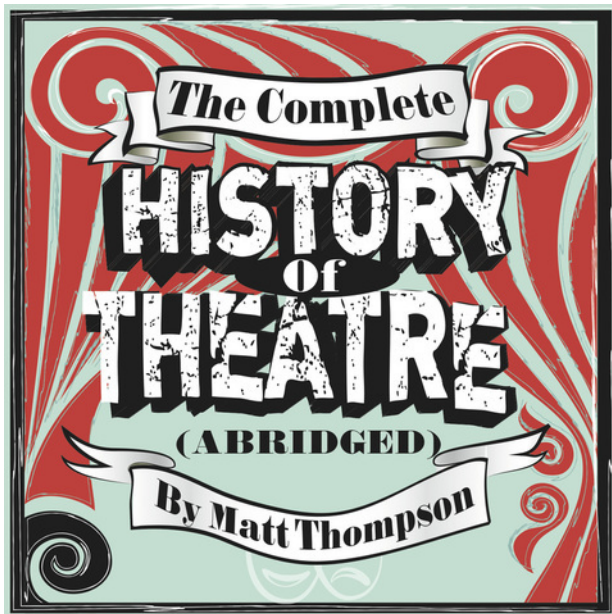
