In January 2004, Alan Ziter was hired as the Executive Director of the NTC Foundation to oversee the restoration of 26 historic buildings at the former Naval Training Center and reopen them as new Arts, Culture and Creativity

district while preserving the history of this special place and the stories of the millions of recruits who passed through it. Already it is home to dozens of San Diego's most creative and innovative people and organizations.

One of the leading arts advocates in California, Alan is a founding board member and past chair of the California Arts Advocates, a former 5-year board member and officer for the California Confederation of the Arts and founder and past co-chair of the San Diego Arts and Culture Coalition.

He served 3 years on the San Diego Regional Chamber of Commerce and also on Mayor Susan Golding's Naval Training Center Citizens Implementation Advisory Committee.

The first staff person hired by the San Diego Performing Arts League in April 1986, under his direction the League grew to 11 staff members serving a membership of over 140 theatres, music and dance companies in San Diego County.

He created and oversaw the implementation of programs that include the ARTS TIX half-price ticket booth, Business Volunteers for the Arts, Technology for the Arts, Family Theatre Days, the *What's Playing* performing arts guide, and the BRAVO San Diego campaign to strengthen Arts and Business Partnerships.

Prior to coming to San Diego in 1986, Alan was Marketing Director for the League of Chicago Theatres and worked in the Chicago office of the Shubert Organization.
