Voltaire Bridge Rehabilitation Progress

After being in the discussion/planning stage for 16 years, the long awaited Voltaire Bridge –Wabaska rehabilitation project is moving forward. Bids are going out early 2017 and construction is scheduled for summer 2017. In addition to the bridge rehabilitation, the Voltaire bridge project will include re design of the Voltaire Wabaska right of way and a narrowing of Wabaska Drive so as to include a bicycle lane and a sidewalk.

The City plans to install a square chain link fence, required by the State of CA, on the Voltaire Bridge. The PCPB, PLA and some community leaders proposed a more attractive treatment than the square chain link fence proposed by the City. Several meetings with Dan Nutter, City of San Diego Senior Civil Engineer have led to few concessions mostly based on lack of funds. A last minute gathering with the City on Thursday 8/25 led to 2 additional chain link fence options. A chain

link fence with sheet metal attached and one with scalloped railings. The options will be printed in *The Beacon* to present to the community this week.

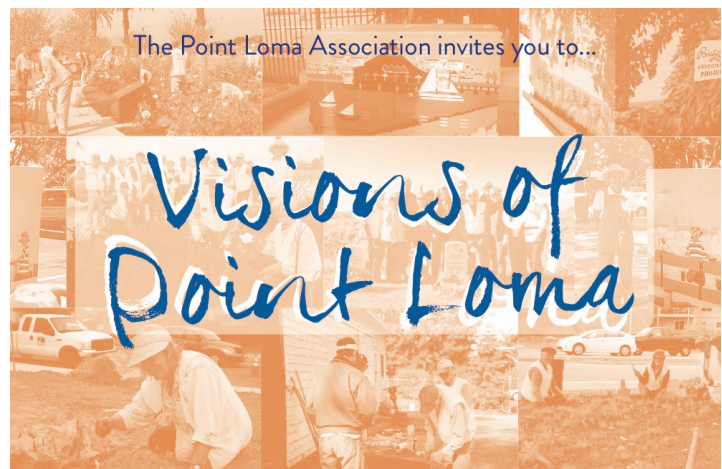
