## Point Loma Assembly Legacy Fund Receives Leading Gift

The Reuben H. Fleet Fund at the San Diego Foundation has made a Leading Gift of \$1,000 to the Point Loma Assembly's newly established Legacy Fund.

An inaugural annual appeal for members and friends to contribute to the Legacy Fund is underway. Contributions to the Fund will be invested in the on going, as-needed restoration and improvement of the Assembly's 1914 building. At this time four levels of annual contributions are being recognized:

- Benefactor (\$500+)
- Champion (\$250-\$499)

- Keeper (\$50-\$99).

The Leading Gift of \$1,000 was at the request of Lori Fleet-Martin, a member of the Fleet family and an Assembly member. Lori's great-grandfather was Reuben H. Fleet. He moved Consolidated Aircraft Corporation to San Diego's Lindbergh Field in 1935 and lived in Point Loma, right up the street from the Assembly, at the end of Gage. The Fleet family name is well known for leadership, community and philanthropy, granting more than \$16 million to non-profit organizations in San Diego over many years. The Assembly is honored to be recognized.
