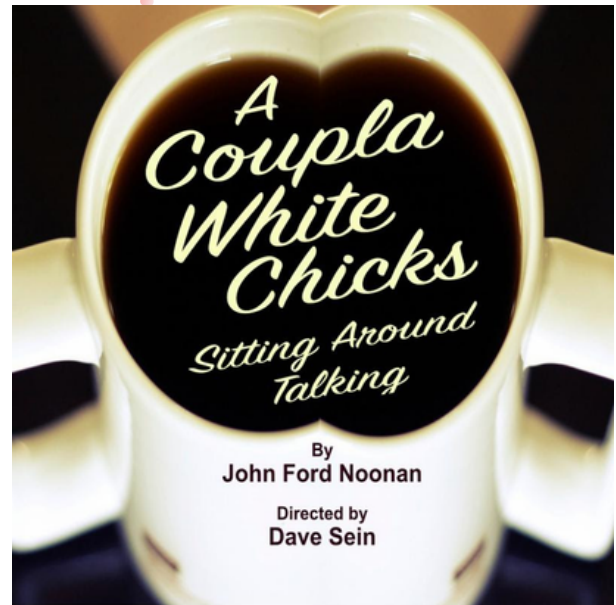
Anthropologist and history buff Dr. Frank Newton will speak the eventual demise of the Inca Empire.
