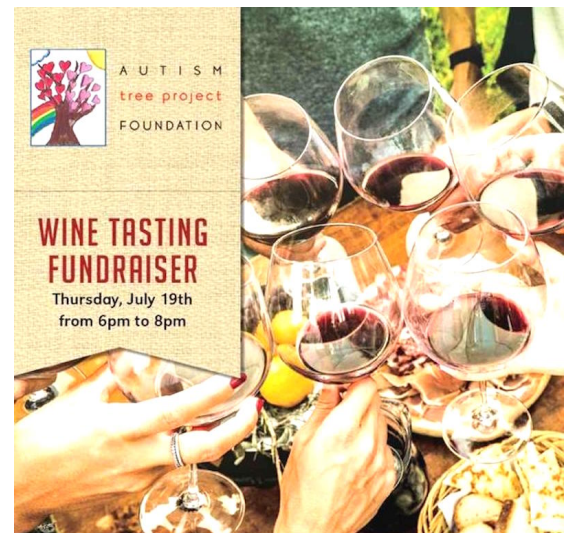
We've Done It !

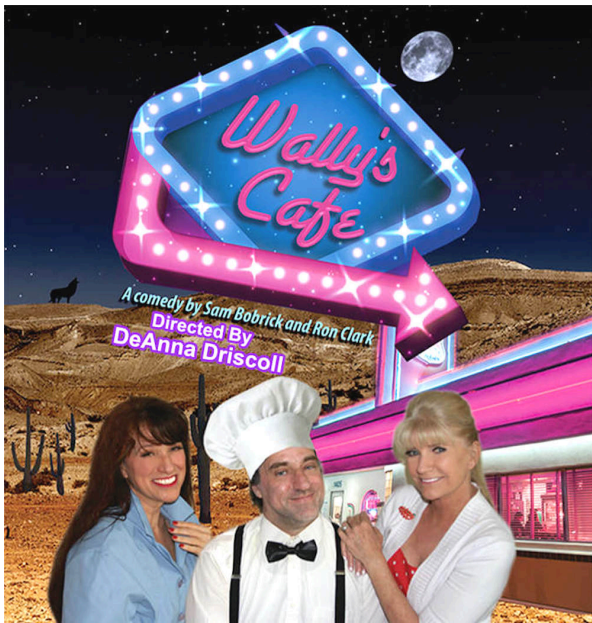

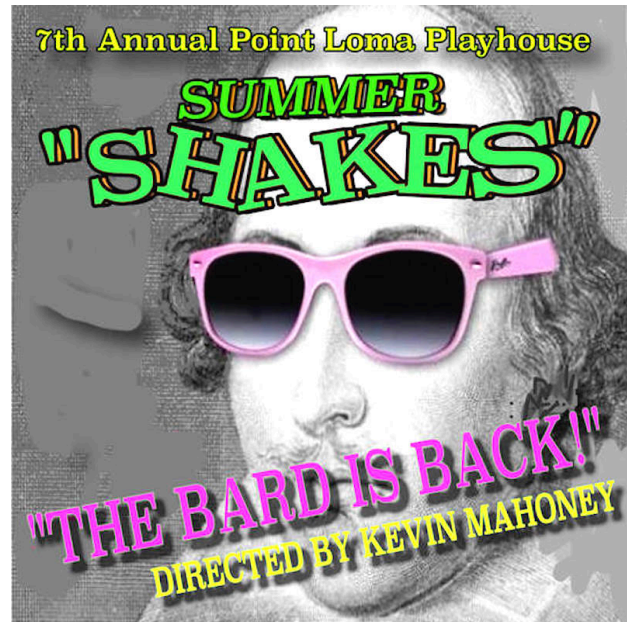
