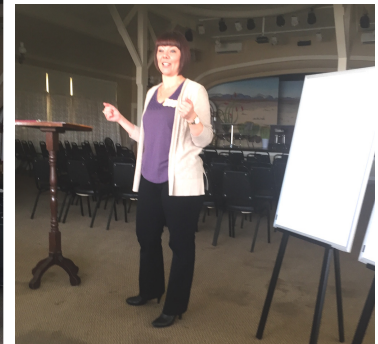

Watching the installation of our latest Board of Directors caused me to think back over the last several years. Back to the time when long-time Assembly member Edwina Goddard raised the alarm that the Assembly building was going to change hands and would no longer be the Clubhouse of the membership. Her brilliance in reaching out to Dorothea Laub made all the difference in the world!

Dottie immediately got to work and rounded up the necessary people and resources to rejuvenate the organization and keep the building for the community.

I was honored when Dottie asked me to be the President. It was a privilege to work with our Membership Chairs to build the membership up from the less than 20 members at the time.

Working with our House Manager to increase the number of rentals was important and we lost a few tenants as we gradually increased the rent from around \$25 an hour! We revised the

bylaws, worked on long deferred building maintenance issues, and held long, drawn out meetings trying to understand our Mission and Vision. Now we have a smoothly running organization that is fiscally sound, offers great programs for the members and is a true asset to the community. The building has been completely rewired, air conditioned (!), and upgraded in so many ways, even hosting a wonderful little theater company that is getting rave reviews for their productions on our stage. It truly is amazing to think what has occurred since this time in 2012. Six short years!

Congratulations to the current Board and Thank You for your efforts. It's never easy but it is really worthwhile!
