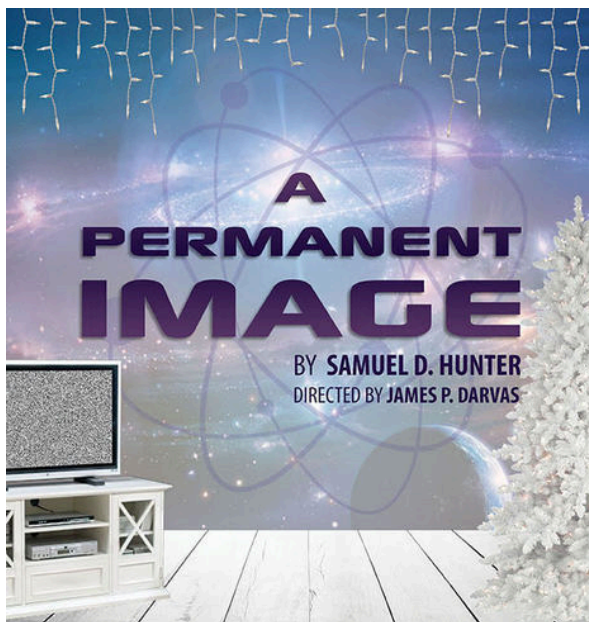

The Assembly is, of course, a place. A rather wonderful white building at 3035 Talbot Street, standing in Point Loma for over 100 years. For Assembly members, maintaining and enhancing this gem is a large part of our mission. In 2012 we began the process by repairing the leaking roof, installing a bathroom and creating an entrance ramp. Later we added heating and air conditioning, Wi-Fi and recently, new flooring. This beautiful space has been widely improved and is now comfortably attractive for gatherings and celebrations of all kinds. The Assembly rental program is anchored by a local, very successful theater group and is regularly utilized by many nonprofit, educational organizations. It is a wonderful venue for concerts, business meetings and numerous celebrations.

The members of the Assembly share a second mission filled with pride, vision, generosity and endless opportunity. We have nurtured our home into a focal point for sharing experiences, making new friends, networking and learning. The Assembly is not a community center, but it is most definitely a *center of community*. We have elevated our growing rental income into a powerful source of ready assets to reinvest in our community. We have been able to direct these funds to expand the library of Cabrillo Elementary, buy Christmas gifts for 83 enlisted Armed Services YMCA members and sponsor expenditures for the Point Loma High School NJROTC underwater Robotics team. All these donations were approved through the thoughtful deliberations of our Assembly Board. Soon we will be discussing supporting the swim program for Correia Middle School at the Peninsula YMCA and supporting STEM teaching programs at Cabrillo National Monument.
