## Our January Meeting...

At the fourth general meeting of 2020-2021 for the Point Loma Assembly, Board Cecilia Carrick introduced San Diego City Council President Dr. Jennifer Campbell and Monique Tello, Dr. Campbell's Community Representative for Point Loma and Pacific Beach. Dr. Campbell represents Council District 2 (made up of the Point Loma, Ocean Beach, Midway, Pacific Beach, Mission Beach, Mission Bay, Linda Vista and Clairemont areas).

Dr. Campbell moved to San Diego 13 years ago. She attended George Washington University and

received her medical degree from the University of Pittsburgh and practiced family medicine for over 37 years. Dr. Campbell regularly attends community meetings and has served on the boards of the San Diego Human Dignity Foundation, the Clairemont Town Council and the San Diego County Democratic Central Committee.

She acknowledged that there are many complex issues currently facing the city that have parties with widely differing opinions.



Talking about the achievements of the City Council over the past year, Dr. Campbell mentioned the difficulty caused by the current corona virus. Recently, the City Council partnered with the San Diego Padres and UCSD Medical to set-up a site at Petco Park to be used to vaccinate over 5,000 people per day with the new covid vaccines. Dr. Campbell explained in detail the

recently voter-approved Measure E effecting the Midway District. She spoke about traffic congestion, the new height limits and types of housing and business development and amenities.

She also spoke about how the city has helped small

businesses, renters, food banks and many other areas during the pandemic.

A "Question and Answer" period followed Dr. Campbell's presentation, with excellent participation by our members.
