2022 Legacy Fund Campaign Begins in October

Since its initiation in 2016, the Legacy Fund has raised \$78,035 to supplement income received from memberships, building rentals, and grants to enhance and maintain the Assembly's historic property at 3035 Talbot Street. Members will learn more about the 2022 Legacy Fund Campaign as letters arrive in mailboxes in October!

The most recent improvements and repairs to the Assembly Hall removed crumbling paint at the building's eaves; repainted the eaves, the trim and front pillars, the front porch and stairway on the exterior; the interior was painted where most needed; the back door was repaired; and the unsafe ramp along the rear of the building was removed. In the new year the Board plans to consult with an expert in the Arts and Crafts style to ensure that future renovation plans reflect the era in which the Assembly Hall was constructed.

From 1924 until the present day, Scripps Institution of Oceanography has tied up its ships to docks on Point Loma. Together with the U.S. Navy's Submarine Support Facility, Point Loma has been the home port to extraordinary missions to sea that have pushed the boundaries of engineering, science, commerce, and warfare.

Speaker Kevin Hardy, Scripps Institution Ocean Engineer, 1972 – 2012, and Founder of Global Ocean Design, 2012 to present, will be joined by noted local author and PLHS Pointer alum, John Freeman, who will debut his new book, "Astounding! A Pictorial History of San Diego". Freeman has assembled a broad collection of tales of San Diego's accomplishment in numerous fields. In 1952, Hollywood Swashbuckler Errol Flynn took a group of scientists from the Scripps Institution of Oceanography on an expedition from Point Loma, through the Panama Canal to the Caribbean, collecting samples for scientific research aboard his two-masted 118 foot schooner, Zaca. Flynn's film of ocean exploration, "Cruise of the Zaca", preceded Jacques Yves Cousteau's "Silent World" by 4 years.
