Learn About the Proposed Midway Rising Project

Our November 10th meeting is a presentation by the Midway Rising development team selected by the San Diego City Council and endorsed by Mayor Todd Gloria at their Sept 13th meeting. Their vision is to redevelop the current Pechanga Arena/ Midway site of 48.5 acres to include 4,250 housing units, 250 middle income units, a modern 16,000 seat Sports Arena, a 200 room hotel, 450,000 sq. ft. of retail and entertainment space and 20 acres of associated open space. This proposal relies on Prop C to pass which is on the Nov. 8th ballot and sets the stage for their negotiations with the City of San Diego over the next two years.

The Point Loma Assembly is neither for or against this development proposal or Prop. C. We do not advocate positions on political issues and take pride in being a community gathering place for our members, Point Loma residents and guests for over 100 years. We hope you will join us on Nov. 10th!
