NTC Arts District will have memberships to the NTC Foundation available and will discuss their new collaboration with Cygnet Theatre.

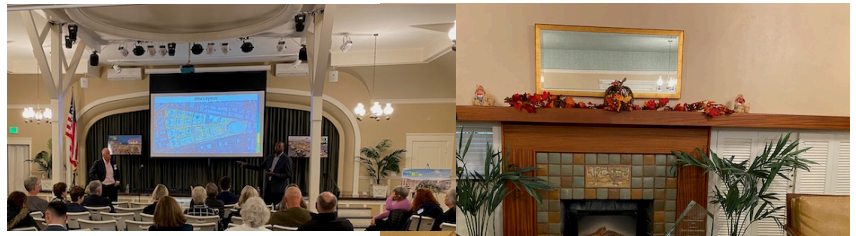

Member **Wendy Gillespie** will offer interesting imports and holiday themed items for sale and member **Margaret Cooper** will show one of a kind jewelry for purchase.



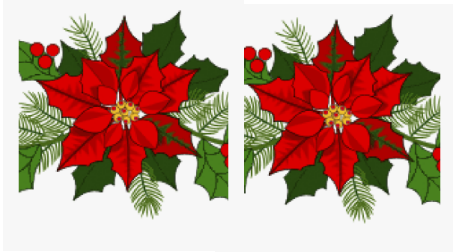
Point Loma Assembly's Mission:
