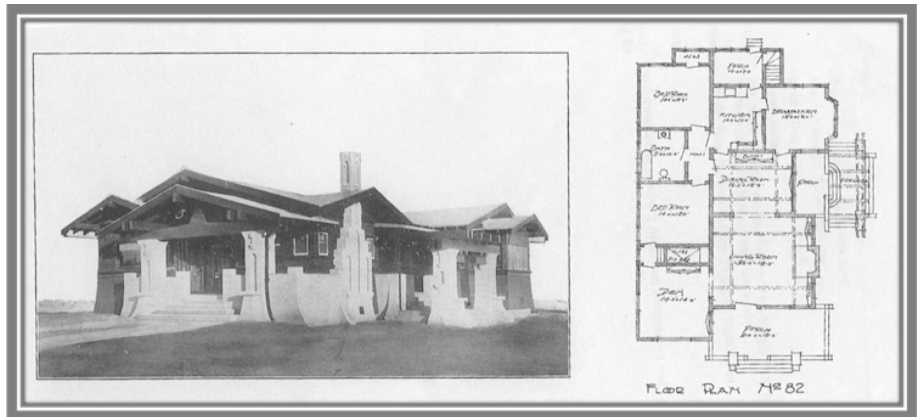

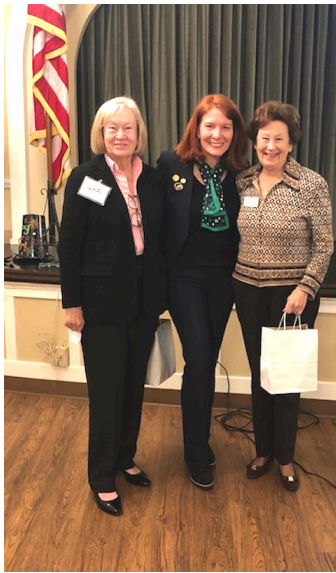

January's Community Impact Meeting

Thank you to the following Assembly Members who came together to hear about needs in our community in 2023: Dorothea Laub, Klonie Kunzel, Jean Durgan, Sally Bixler, Cecilia Carrick, Mary Katherine Reeber, Patti Adams, Vickie Lareau, Lynn Silva, Dr. Robert Novak, Dr Julia Cowan Novak, and Carolyn Bick.

The group met January 17 to discuss Point Loma Community needs and to hear proposals from members and guests for donations made by the Assembly. The one-and one-half hour meeting was informative, full of good questions and thoughtful discussion so much so that the group agreed to meet again. The meeting date is Tuesday, March 14 from noon to 1:30 at the Assembly Hall.

Presentations were made in support of the following:

Peninsula Shepherds Center for Seniors needs operating funds to support the many daily activities at the Center. The Center assists seniors so that they may remain in their homes as long as possible. They offer rides via a van service and have activities for education and enrichment.

Total Altruistic Program, TAPS, presented an innovative project to encourage individuals picking up trash in their neighborhood parks. The project needs seed money to participate in a study with Mesa College Students to replicate the model and measure improved litter free parks.

Liberty School, an NTC project, is providing art instruction to students at

Dewey Elementary and can use funds to continue the program.

The Cabrillo National Park Foundation requested funds for the Ecologik Program, a series of STEM learning classes and activities targeting girls who might not get the opportunity to participate elsewhere.

La Playa Trail Association presented a new project to mark the intersection of the La Playa Trail and a trail that led to Ocean Beach. It is the group's desire to erect the marker at the intersection of Lytton and Rosecrans in the Southwest corner. Seed money would assure that the project will move quickly after permits are awarded.

Point Loma Summer Concerts requested funds to continue the quality family music in the parks concerts this summer.

The Bicycle Hub, a project being developed at NTC, is requesting funds to make the center a reality.

There was an update regarding **La Playa Yacht Club**. Their Board is working on obtaining 501(c)3 status.

The Monarch School, which offers K-12 education to children who are homeless or living in shelters is requesting operating funds . The needs of aged out foster children are many. Housing, higher education, job training, and mentoring are needed to help these young people be successful. There are several vetted programs that need financial support.

Cabrillo Elementary continues to be a project of importance to the Assembly. Currently arts education for the school is being researched.
